She is to illustrate a poem written by another kiwi young writer. This is a fabulous achievement Maddi - we are excited to see your piece published.

Our Year 5&6 and Year 7&8 netball teams have had opportunities to play in the Southland Festival of Netball and also the Western Southland Competition. Thanks to Coaches, Managers, Umpires, Transporters, and Supporters. Our students have impressed with their development of throwing and catching, attack defence and shooting skills, while working as a team.

Speech presentations started today with our Year 5-8 students sharing with their classes for judging selection to go through to HVP School Finals. These are required to select 2 from each year group to represent Hauko Valley at the Western Cluster Finals on Friday 26th August at Waiau Area School from 11.00am. The Year 4 students have another week to prepare as their first year involves just our school competition. For our Year 1-3 students involved in Poetry Recitals, they all share at one time as a celebration of their memorization along with volume, pace, expression, and clarity.

As a school, we are constantly evolving with our learning. There are several agencies that we can access to support us in our journey. The Learning Support Coordinator role that Terrence holds coordinates support for whanau; this can include anything from attendance, health, learning, behaviour through a wide range of services and organisations. Generally classroom teachers source his guidance and at some stage he may contact you. We can also support you with Speech Language Therapy or Ngai Tahu applications just get in touch with Julia. We also have a Public Health Nurse, Karen, that is available to all of our families. If at anytime you require additional support or guidance in regard to Health Education, please let me know and I can arrange an informal time to meet with Karen, (either at home or school).

We aspire to "Always Our Best" *Tonu tou tatou pai* or as Maya Angelou said - *"Do the best you can until you know better. Then when you know better, do better."* In the New Zealand Curriculum, there is clear intent on lifelong learning through the Key Competencies. Our focus is to ensure our learners have a toolkit (kete) of skills that enable them to engage with the vision of the New Zealand Curriculum; that being - confident, connected, actively involved, lifelong learners when they leave HVP. That goal is only possible through our Home and School Partnerships. If you need to connect with us to support a learner, please do. 




