Home & School Annual General Meeting

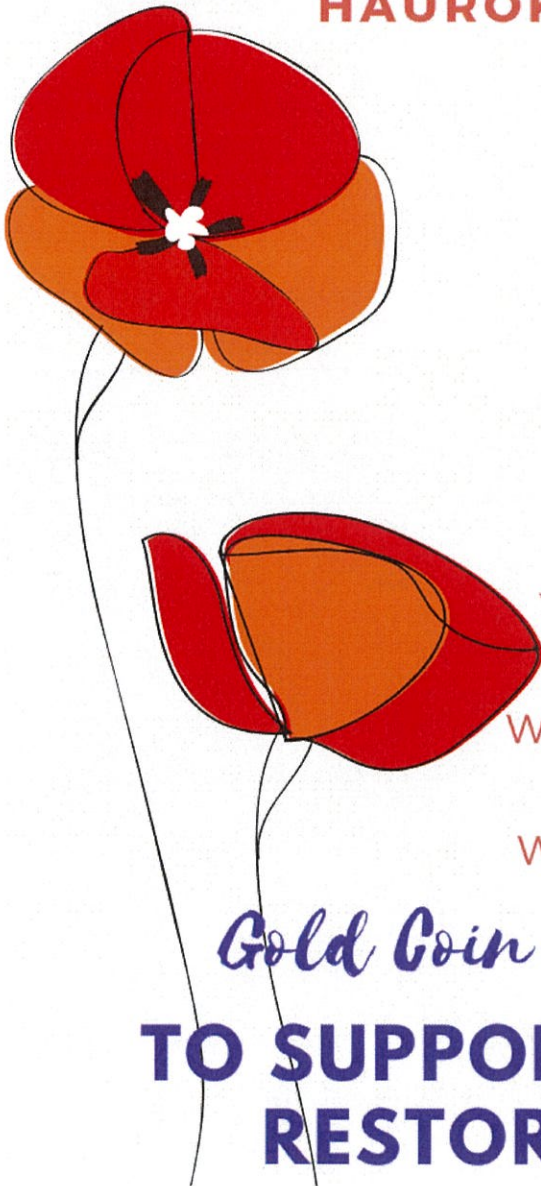
Wednesday 11th May 2022 7.30pm

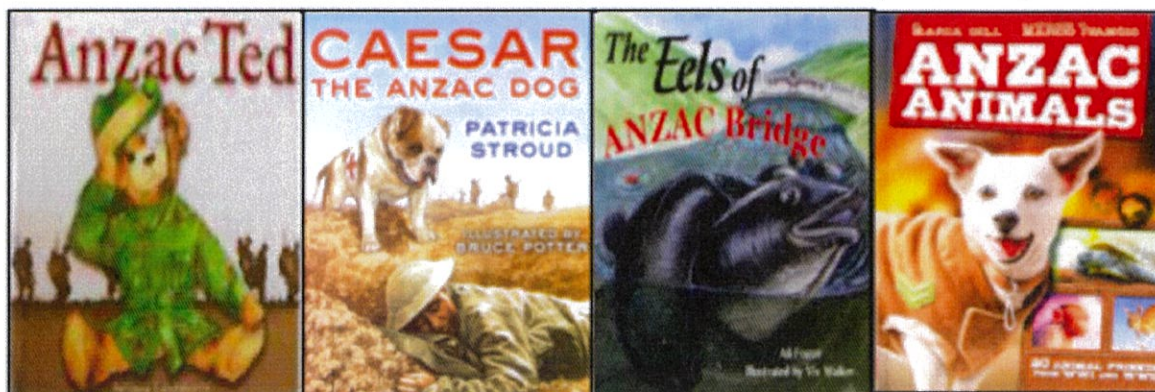
