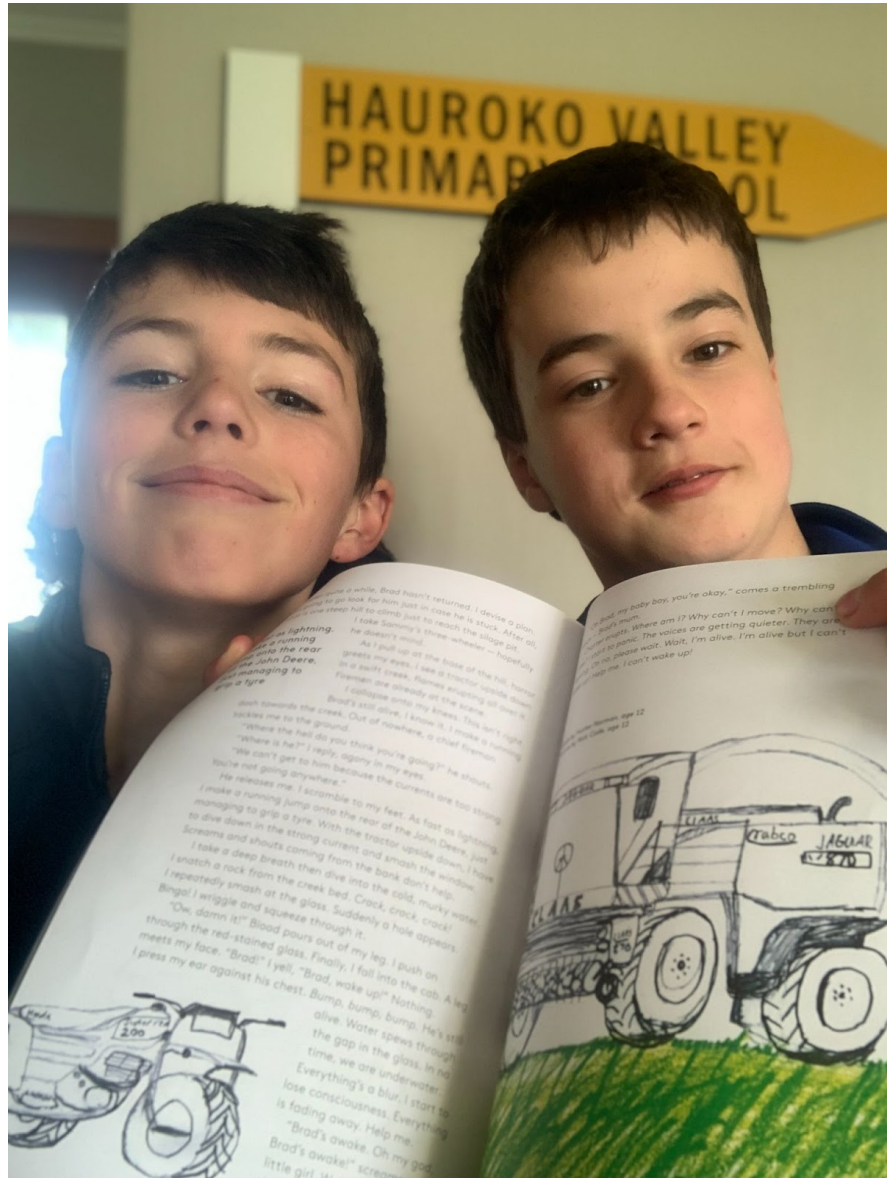

Te Reo Feature

The theme for the 2021 Maori Language Week is “Kia Kaha te Reo Māori - Let's make the Māori language strong”. This is an opportunity to acknowledge and learn Māori language and culture by using and speaking the language. Join us on our journey!

Macrons Ngā tohutō
A macron is a line written above a vowel and indicates a long vowel sound. Many people are unsure when to use them, but they make a big difference!

For example Hei tauira
He keke māu? → He kēkē māu?
Would you like some cake? → Would you like some armpit?

Macrons: ā as in car, ē as in measure, ī as in heel, ō as in your, ū as in roof

Consonants Ngā orokati
ng as in singer
wh as in father
r is a rolling 'r' sometimes described as being close to an English 'd' or 'l' sound

Consonants: p t k m n ng, wh r h w

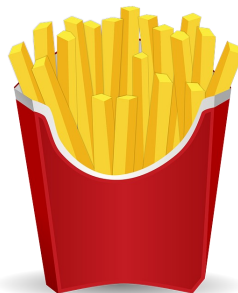
