R.E.A.D. I.T. Home Reading Guide

At Hauroko Valley Primary School we utilise the Kluwell Home Reading Diaries in Years 1-6 to record reading. The booklets are progressive allowing for greater independence as the student progresses through each year level.

Teachers Role

- For students learning to read, they will be provided with a guided reading text each day for completion at home. Often this is reading the entire text or could be part of a read e.g. a chapter.
- Check the home reading diary of every child in the class each week.
- Comment each week in the home reading diary, regarding the home reading completed over the week.
- Track students' home reading on the class readometer chart.
- Complete the awards when students reach targets of 25, 50, 75, 100..... 250.
- Ensure students place stickers to indicate they have achieved their reading night target.
- Provide an opportunity for students to visit Mrs Waikato to share their reading goal achievements.

Parents Role

- Have a routine established allowing for reading to take place e.g. before dinner, after dinner, bedtime, or first thing in the morning, etc....
- Find a suitable place for reading e.g: a comfortable chair, couch, etc... It might need to be a quiet space.
- Encourage, praise, and make reading time positive.
- Record the date and title of the text being read.
- Track the number of reading nights so numerically ordered.
- · Aim to read at least 4 nights a week.
- Comment each night if you would like to share how the child went with their reading. Older students can write their own comments about the text read.
- Check the home reading diary is coming home each day and returning to school regularly.
- Ask questions to support the child in their reading understanding.
- Please sign at least once weekly to reinforce the completion of home reading.

Students Role

- Ensure they put their guided reading text in their home reading pack or school bag to go home daily.
- Return their guided reading text regularly.
- Hand in their home reading diary to the class teacher, each week.
- Read as often as possible.
- Enjoy reading to learn or learning to read.
- Look after the Home Reading Diary so the targets are cumulative.
- Older students can write a comment about their reading or the text in the comment section.
- Let classroom teachers know they have achieved their target.
- Celebrate the achievement of reading when reaching each target with a visit to share with Mrs Waikato.


