## Firewise Learning:

Students in Matai have been learning to be Firewise. So far, students have learned about the different uses for fire, including cooking, heating, as a light source, or used for celebration. Students have learnt how to keep themselves safe by keeping a 'metre from the heater', to avoid playing near a heat source, and to tell an adult if a fire is unattended. Matai have also been learning about matches, lighters, and candles - the difference between toys and tools when it comes to being Firewise.

## Carols in the Cave:






