<u>Igneous metamorphic</u> - there are two types of igneous rocks, extrusive and intrusive.

<u>Igneous Extrusive</u> - lava shoots up and solidifies above the Earth's surface.

Western Southland Golf Festival Tuesday 24th October 2023




