

COVID-19 Update

As you all know things are moving quickly with the current Omicron outbreak. With the move to Phase 3, things have become more simplified as you will see in the images below.

The major changes are:

- Only confirmed cases or household contacts to a confirmed case have to isolate – for a period of 10 days.
- All other contacts, such as classmates or staff should monitor for symptoms.
- Please still notify us if you are a household contact or a positive case. You can either phone the school during the school day or email me after hours.



You will need to self-isolate from others if you:

are positive for COVID-19

live with a positive case

You must isolate at home or in suitable alternative accommodation. If you test positive for COVID-19, a health professional will help you decide if managed isolation is suitable for you.

Isolate for 10 days from when you test positive

Isolate for 10 days

No further tests required unless directed to

Tests on Day 3 and Day 10

<i>I am angry</i>	Kei te riri




