SMALL RURAL SCHOOL UPGRADES

The Ministry of Education is updating Hauroko Valley Primary School with lighting, acoustics, or insulation in parts of the administration and classroom blocks. This is part of a government initiative to improve the internal environments of small schools.

We have a container being delivered onsite in early April (next week), which will be located in our roadside car park near the admin block. Please keep this area clear and take care when buses are about, at drop off 8.15 am-8.30 am and pick up 2.50 pm-3.20 pm.

Over the installation, classes will be relocated as needed (likely to the administration block). We expect there will be some interruptions. However, it is a welcome upgrade, and we know it will be completed within a short time.






