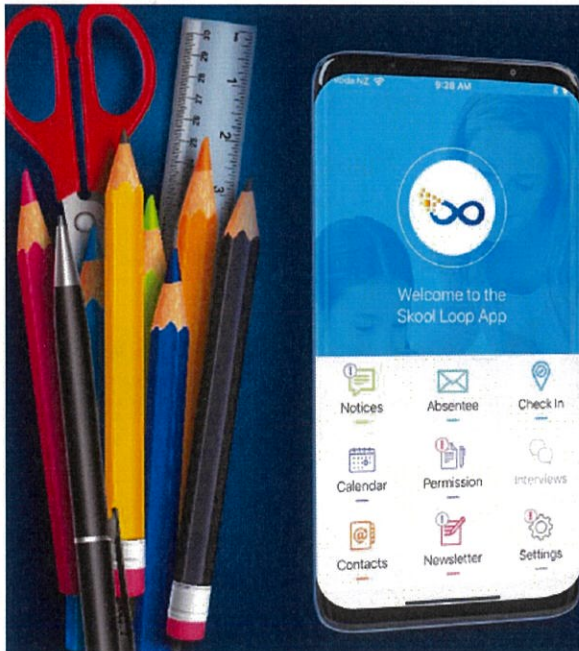



Is your teen off to boarding school or university next year? If so, it is important that they're vaccinated against Meningococcal disease.

Meningococcal disease, often referred to as meningitis, is an uncommon but serious infection caused by the bacteria *Neisseria meningitidis*. A person with meningococcal disease can develop meningitis, septicaemia or pneumonia. It strikes and progresses quickly - usually without warning.

Vaccination is the most effective way to prevent meningitis & there are two funded vaccines available at [Tuatapere Medical Centre](#) for those who are living in a close proximity situation such as halls of residence or boarding houses,

- **Menectra**, is a one off dose which protects against Meningococcal A, C, Y & W, which account for up to 49% of cases.
- **Bexsero**-a two dose course, eight weeks apart. It protects against Meningococcal B which accounts for up to 45% of cases of meningitis. In 2014-2017 Group B caused 2/3 of Meningitis Cases
