

Kia ora e te whaanau, kumusta, ayubowan,

Technology Year 7&8. We have rescheduled our planned Term 3 cooking until Term 4, to ensure we provide a balanced programme across both terms, and to secure a preferred day. This part of Tech will involve 4 days on Fridays in Term 4 with dates TBC.

Our Year 0-3 students are learning a **poem** to present at our poetry recitals. As this is part of Literacy, learners are being supported in class to memorise and present their poem. This is always better if practiced at home with your support, too. You are welcome to liaise with classroom teachers if you would like assistance. Criteria for Judging include;

Year 0-1 - speaking with a volume for the audience to hear, a clear voice, presenting with a 'just right' pace and memorising the poem, having eye contact with the audience, and a confident posture

Year 2 - as above for Years 0-1, then the inclusion of expression in voice.

Year 3 - as above for Years 0-1 and Year 2, then includes natural gestures.

Our Year 4-8 learners are preparing their speeches for presentation. This is a significant piece of work that requires two parts. The first, being written by learners before learning for presentation. How to help at homerehearse, rehearse, rehearse - run through the walk-on and intro, then just the conclusion. Becoming more familiar with your speech through regular rehearsals makes for comfortable and confident presentations. Judging focuses on the following;

- 1. Speech Content an intro that gains attention, logical order of points, strong conclusion, vocabulary, and language suitable for the topic /6
- 2. **Delivery** eye contact, expressive face, clear, strong voice well projected and clearly spoken, natural gestures, cue cards used well, and stance/posture. /8
- 3. Originality depth of thought, originality, sophistication, humour, message, engaging audience /6

Our Poetry and Speech Finals will be held on Friday, 8th August, with the Year 4s up first - a straight final from 9.00 am. From approximately 9.45 am, our Year 5&6 finalists will present their speeches. We are aiming for 11.00 am for our Year 7&8 finalists, then for our Year 0-3 children, poetry presentations from 12.00 pm, finishing in time for lunch. You are welcome to join us to celebrate our students' learning.

A massive thank you to our Home and School Crew for their support of Hauroko Valley Primary. They are key to supporting us with multiple activities throughout the year. Of course, fundraising through the Blackmount Trail Ride and the Stock Donation Scheme is our major initiative. As well, the Home and School support our staff with school activities - pet day, cross country, working bees, Matariki hangi/brunch, and various other events. 




