Congratulations to our Western Southland representatives who competed at the **Southland Primary School's Cross Country** last Friday. In the 10-year-old boys, there were 66 runners Flynn placed 15th and Finley 25th. For the 11-year-old boys Louie placed 34th, Fergal 35th, and Boe 54th out of 80 runners. For our 12-year-old runners, Jake placed 22nd with James 23rd out of 51 runners. While our 12-year-old girls had 40 runners in their race - Lily was 6th, Libby 7th, and Sienna 10th. For the 13-year-old boys Cormac was 26th, and George 28th out of 42 runners. Such tremendous results for our long-distance runners!








Social Science Fair
