## School Description

Hauroko Valley Primary School is a small U2, Decile 7, rural school located in Western Southland. The school opened as Hauroko Valley Primary in 1999 following a merger between Clifden and Orawia Schools that year. Following the closure of Blackmount School mid-year 2014 our catchment area has increased. In 2017 Hauroko Valley Primary School completed the recapitation process to include Year 7&8 students.

The school's picturesque grounds are set amidst farmland and it is situated on the Southern Scenic Route on Highway 99 just South of the Waiau River and the Historical Clifden Suspension Bridge. The local community is predominantly involved in farming although other economic activities include tourism and horticulture.

There is a diversity of cultures with Maori, Pasifika and Asian students. Hauroko Valley Primary School is in an area of Maori significance and we acknowledge our unique position within our study of our Maori culture. The close proximity of Lake Hauroko, Great New Zealand Walk – The Hump Ridge Track, Fiordland National Parks, Takitimu Mountains, Waiau River and Te Waewae Bay/Pacific Ocean means the area also offers a wide range of outdoor opportunities.

Hauroko Valley Primary School's roll is currently 81 children and is staffed by the Principal who leads a team of 4 dynamic teachers, 2 teacher aides, an administration secretary, a part time caretaker and two part time cleaners. The school has three well-resourced classrooms, a multi-purpose room, administrative block, modern bookroom, large school field, school garden, paddock, playground and a netball/tennis court. The school values fosters the relationships it has with its parents and the wider community and in turn is extremely well supported by our local community.

## The Education Act (2020)

- Maori language and culture is incorporated into daily classroom activities as well as being included into classroom and whole school planning.
- We will ensure that all reasonable steps are taken to provide instruction in Tikanga Maori (Maori culture) and Te Reo Maori (the language) for all students. This may be achieved in a variety of ways in consultation with families through using school based expertise/resources, online resources, correspondence programme or using the Resource Teacher for Maori service.
- Teachers will adopt the cultural competencies of Tataiako and Tapasa.
- We will utilize Ka Hikitia Accelerating Success resource as a guide when planning for the future success of our Maori students.

- Treasure a collaborative relationship with whanau/community.
