As we draw to the close of another year, we are proud of our achievements in academic, sporting and cultural pursuits. We know we punch above our weight, and we are proud of reaching these high standards. Time and time again, we work hard, striving for excellence, and "Always Our Best/tonu ta tatou pai" when participating in and competing in a range of opportunities.

More importantly, we are proud of when our students shine in school and when out and about through the use of their School Values, manners, and Key Competencies. We are continually working to grow great learners and leaders, the BEST in the WEST, so they go well in the world!

Reading, Writing and Maths Targets

We have hit our targets in reading, writing, and mathematics, with improvements shown across all year levels. There is always progress and achievement along the learning journey, and we have consistently met our reading and maths targets over several years. However, this year we have met our writing target too!

90% of all Hauroko Valley Primary School students are at/above the well-above level in reading.

88% of all Hauroko Valley Primary School students are at/above the well-above level in writing.

85% of all Hauroko Valley Primary School students are at/above the well-above level in mathematics.

Next year, we will be implementing changes to our assessments to ensure they align with the new curriculum. The Ministry of Education is yet to provide guidance on the assessments we are to utilise. Consequently, our report format is likely to differ, and usual measures are unlikely to be comparable to previous reporting. We will keep you updated.

Water Safety Skills

This week, our children have been involved in sessions from the Water Safety Skills for Life. Across Aotearoa, children head to beaches, rivers, and pools. There are still many children who are unprepared for when things go wrong. Water Skills for Life recognises that no child should be at risk simply because they don't know how to float, recognise hazards, or call for help. In our coverage of essential water skills, we know we are doing our bit to help our children know what to do if ever needed.

Carols In The Caves/Prize Giving

Thank you (in advance) for joining us for Carols In The Caves. Our classes have prepared a song for you to enjoy. We have also been learning some Christmas songs to share as a whole school. It is a pleasure to see so many of our school families joining us and sharing with our wider school community, including ex-students and their families. Craig Smith aka The Wonky Donkey man






