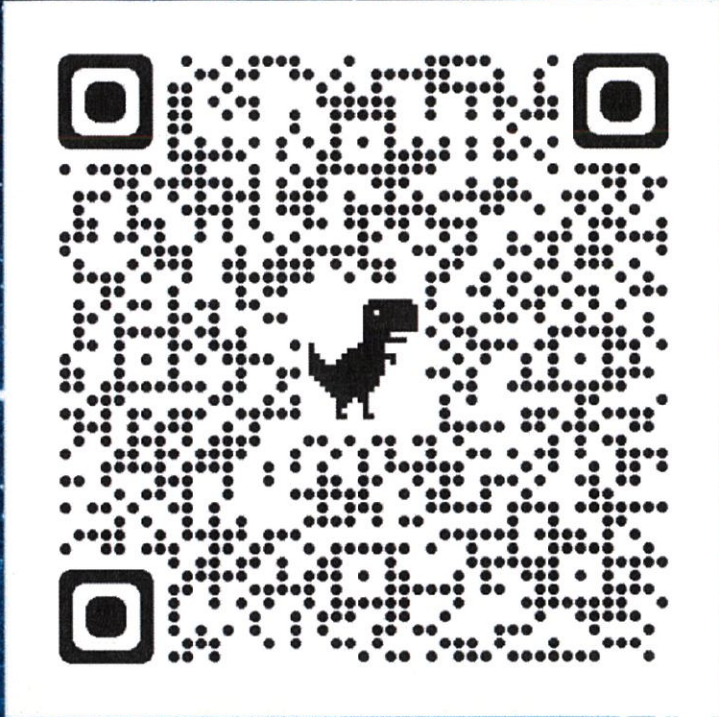




WOW - thanks to Ann Robbie, our Memorial Board has been returned after some restoration work and is looking superb! If you would like to see this, it is just inside our administration block.

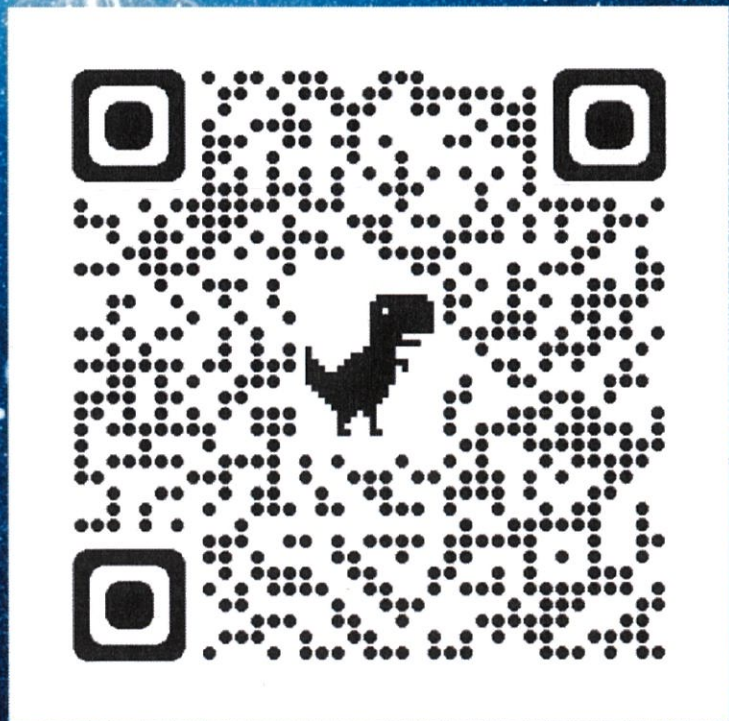

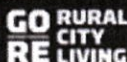
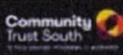
