Matariki Weaving

Thanks to Des Cooper for visiting Hauroko Valley Primary School to share his weaving talents. Des passed on his Matariki knowledge to provide us with a deeper understanding of the Maori New Year. Originally flax or harakeke was used for practical purposes. He showed taonga (treasures) that can be made from harakeke including rope, baskets, bags and putiputi (flowers). Des guided our students through the tikanga of collecting flax so they are aware of interconnectedness and interrelationships between people and the land.

Hangi

In Maori culture manaakitanga is a traditional value that is considered important. Showing manaakitanga is a combination of aroha, hospitality, generosity and mutual respect for one another. HVP values the manaakitanga our school community brings in spades - thank you. Whanaungatanga is also a foundational value of Maori culture shown throughout our place as we support each other as part of our collective as Hauroko Valley Primary School.

Thanks so much to our so many helpers; the staffroom had a fun energy with a group of Rata students and parents working together as they peeled and cut potatoes, kumara, onions, carrots and pumpkins. We are super appreciative of the adults that spent today prepping the fire pit, laying and lifting the hangi. Cheers to those that assisted with serving the kai and the clean up too.

Today's Matariki celebration wouldn't have been possible without many people, however I'd like to make a special mention firstly of Alice Harris for connecting and organising people and resources. An extra special mention to Rosanne and Pete Fowle for providing us with this amazing opportunity to come together as a school family. Mid Year Reports

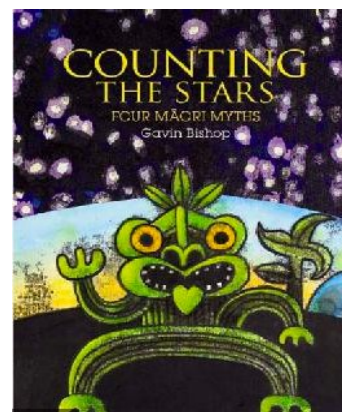
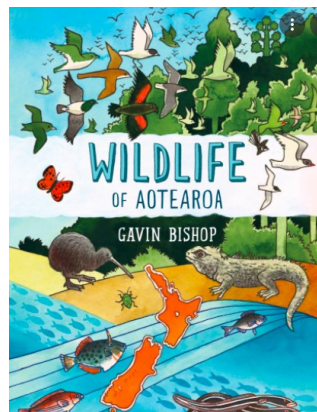
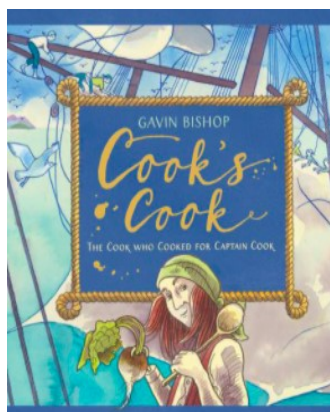
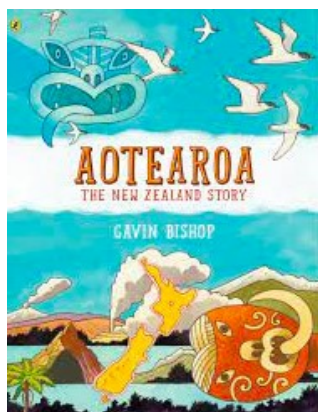
