It was amazing to see so many of our students sharing their learning with us - we had drummers, and guitarists - acoustic, bass and electric, drums, keyboard, ukulele, and vocals. We are delighted to have partnered with KSOM hosting three tutors, Davi, Devin, and Marcus each week for our tamariki. Hauroko Valley certainly has talent!

You can see where your child is tracking against the New Zealand Curriculum as per year level.

Friday 15th December


- · No uniform is required.


